Real Life Environments

Philosophically, we believe that our residents are more successful if the environment in which they live is warm, homelike and integrated into the community. This core belief is a cornerstone at Learning Services and the reason that you find our programs set up the way they are. Some of these underlying principles are:

- Community-integrated living where programs are located near grocery stores, parks, churches, etc...
- Productive therapeutic activities that take place in a homelike setting and/or in the community
- Flexibility with care plan development based on resident, family and/or payer input.
- Age appropriate environments
(Our programs are for adults 18 years and older)
- Co-educational environments
- Private and Semi-private rooms
- Therapeutic day programs incorporating community re-entry

Responsible Staffing Ratios - 3:1 in our Supported Living Residences¹

Our direct care staffing ratios differ from many of our peers in the industry. At Learning Services, we insist on providing more attention to each individual resident, hence our 3:1 staffing ratio. This ratio means that we have only 3 residents for every 1 direct care paraprofessional staff member, which affords our residents the flexibility and freedom to achieve more on their own versus in a group environment.

Collaborative Case Management

Case Management is the backbone of our organization. This discipline is responsible for collaborating with residents, family members, financial partners, as well as a host of specialists to develop and manage each resident's care plan. These specialists are the chief advocates for the residents and responsible for managing the progress of each resident with the goal of achieving meaningful and lasting outcomes.

Comprehensive Teams of Brain Injury Specialists²

Our programs are staffed with Brain Injury Specialists, who support each resident's needs as determined by their individualized care plans. These Brain Injury Specialists provide the tools and experience to guide our residents to achieve outcome after outcome. Some of our Brain Injury Specialists include:

Outcome-Oriented Care

Southern California

Our Southern California program is located just outside of San Diego in the city of Escondido. This program provides adults with acquired brain injuries a residential treatment and supported living program in one of the most picturesque parts of the country.

The campus is located in a residential neighborhood and offers a homelike environment for 25 residents. The shared living residences are complemented by a treatment facility and recreational area. Supported and supervised apartments are also available adjacent to our Southern California campus. The program draws from the wide selection of resources in the community and provides a safe and productive atmosphere for residents to grow and prosper.

Living options at our Southern California program are complemented by a therapeutic day activities program designed to meet each resident's needs and interests through community-supported, productive activities. Residential rehabilitation is offered in the form of physical therapy, occupational therapy, speech language pathology, and psychological counseling. All of the programs are overseen by a trained staff, including: a case manager, a medical support team, as well as a Neuropsychiatrist. The programs are staffed 24 hours per day, 7 days per week.

Learning Services Neurobehavioral Institute – West

Our Southern California Program also benefits from the Learning Services' resources that are only a short plane ride away. Colorado is home to one of Learning Services' signature neurobehavioral program at LSNI-West, as well as additional Learning Services supported living residences.



Our Southern California program is located just 35 miles north of San Diego and convenient to San Diego International Airport.
